WHAT IS BAPTISM?

Baptism (Greek, baptizo - to dip, sink) is the religious practice of immersing a person in water that predates Christianity. Baptism was how proselytes to Judaism (Gentiles who adopted the Jewish faith) were initiated into the Jewish community. John the Baptist took baptism a step further by requiring all people, Jewish and Gentile, to be baptized to signify repentance. John's baptism pointed toward something - Someone - greater, Jesus (Acts 19.1-7).

Now, baptism by water represents something even more important than entrance to Judaism or even simply repentance. Water baptism is a physical representation of a profound spiritual truth. We have all been immersed in the Holy Spirit of God and initiated into the Christian community (the Church).

WHO SHOULD BE BAPTIZED?

Baptism is one of the two ordinances (the other is Communion) mandated of all believers in Jesus Christ. Throughout the New Testament, baptism is either commanded (Matthew 28.19-20) or assumed (Acts 22.16) for all who believe in Christ.

WHY BE BAPTIZED?

1. Baptism is a central part of the Great Commission:

"Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. Teach these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you. And be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age." (Matthew 28.19-20)

2. Baptism does not save anyone, but it is a public demonstration of our salvation.

"Those who believed what Peter said were baptized and added to the church that day - about 3,000 in all." (Acts 2.41)

3. The Bible never separates the act of getting saved from the act of getting baptized:

"They replied, 'Believe in the Lord Jesus and you will be saved, along with everyone in your household.' And they shared the word of the Lord with him and with all who lived in his household. Even at that hour of the night, the jailer cared for them and washed their wounds. Then he and everyone in his household were immediately baptized." (Acts 16.31-33)

"So beginning with the same Scripture, Philip told him the Good News about Jesus. As they rode along, they came to some water, and the eunuch said, 'Look! There's some water! Why can't I be baptized?' He ordered the carriage to stop, and they went down into the water, and Philip baptized him." (Acts 8.36-38)

BAPTISM AT HARVEST CHURCH

Baptism is a vital part of the mission of Harvest Church:

Inspired by the Great Commission, we exist to equip and empower disciples of Jesus who are dedicated to serving the Hesston community and spreading the gospel in our region.

Therefore, obedience in baptism is one of the highest priorities of Harvest Church. We desire to make baptism available frequently and immediately, utilizing several local resources.

If you are a believer in Christ who has not yet been baptized, you should be baptized immediately. We would like to schedule that baptism today.

PARTNERSHIP AT HARVEST CHURCH

At Harvest Church we believe in partnership, not membership.

- Why? Church membership is not a biblical concept. Church partnership is.
- Part of church partnership is the commitment to obey Scripture and financially contribute.
- God initiates all church partnerships because Christ is the Head of the church, and He partners with us to accomplish His work in the world.

Membership – Typically where a person pays financial dues to an organization and receives goods and/or services in return. It can look more like a consumer where the member can cancel if the perceived value they receive doesn't meet their expectations.

Partnership – Active participants in a relationship that is more than just transactional. Each person cares about and supports the organization by investing time, talent, and financial resources to fulfill the Mission and Vision of the organization (Harvest Church).

REQUIREMENTS FOR PARTNERSHIP

- Faith in Jesus Christ for salvation.
- Submit to baptism as a believer and as a public testimony of salvation.
- Agreement with the Statement of Faith.
- Completion of interview by an Elder.
- Acceptance by Board of Elders vote at a regular board meeting.

PARTNERS WILL HAVE THE RIGHT TO VOTE ON THE FOLLOWING:

- The annual budget of the church.
- The disposal of all or parts of the assets of the church valued over \$5,000.
- The merger or “closing” of the church.
- The acquisition of church property in excess of 5% of the church budget.
- Amendments to the Constitution and By-Laws.
- The appointment of Lay Elders.
- The calling or removing of a Vocational Elder(s).
- Multiplication – the decision to plant a new church in our region.
- Other issues the Board of Elders wishes to bring before the congregation for approval.
